It has been quite a while since we planned a tour to this beautiful part of our country. Many of you have asked for it, so here it is! Sign up early so you won't be disappointed when it fills up and you are not a part of it. **YOU MUST HAVE A PASSPORT FOR THIS TOUR**

DAY ONE – WEDNESDAY – AUGUST 8, 2012

Our exciting Pacific Northwest adventure begins today as we travel through South and North Carolina and Tennessee to Clarksville. We will enjoy a delicious buffet dinner at the hotel this evening. (Dinner included)

DAY TWO – THURSDAY – AUGUST 9, 2012

Our destination today is Independence, MO, a suburb of Kansas City. This was President Harry Truman's hometown and his museum and grave sight are located here. (Breakfast included)

DAY THREE – FRIDAY – AUGUST 10, 2012

Today we travel through Missouri and Nebraska to Omaha. In 1859 President Lincoln designated Omaha as the point from which the nation's first transcontinental railroad should go westward. The city has prospered since and now serves as the corporate headquarters for five Fortune 500 companies. On arrival, we will tour Father Flanagan's Boys Town before we check in to our hotel. Founded in 1917, this 900 acre site is now the headquarters for Boys Town programs that help troubled children. (Breakfast included)

DAY FOUR – SATURDAY – AUGUST 11, 2012

This morning we continue our westward trek across the plains of Nebraska to the frontier town of Cheyenne for a two-night stay. This city was named for a tribe of Plains Indians who inhabited southeastern Wyoming. It is now the capital. We will stay in one of our favorite hotels, Little America. The hotel has several beautiful shops, two great restaurants, delicious ice cream and lovely grounds. Look for deer feeding near your rooms in the early morning and evening. (Breakfast included)

DAY FIVE – SUNDAY – AUGUST 12, 2012

You may choose to sleep in this morning, do your laundry, just rest or explore the grounds around the hotel complex. In the afternoon we will tour the city before heading to the Terry Bison Ranch. We will ride a tram into the fields where the buffalo herds are roaming and give you opportunity for some great pictures. Afterwards we will have a chuck wagon steak dinner with entertainment. (Dinner included)

DAY SIX – MONDAY – AUGUST 13, 2012

Our journey today takes us into "Big Sky" country. We will pass through Buffalo and Sheridan, Wyoming, and the Custer Battlefield National Monument to Billings, Montana. One of the most interesting natural features here are the Rimrocks. These buttes rise 400 feet above the Yellowstone Valley and run the length of the city and beyond. Look for the statue of a cowboy on his horse on top of the rocks. William S. Hart, an early Hollywood cowboy star, posed for the sculpture. (Dinner included)

DAY SEVEN – TUESDAY – AUGUST 14, 2012

Spokane, Washington, will be our destination today. We will travel through the tip of Idaho near Coeur d'Alene, a beautiful resort city. We will stay in a suburb of Spokane, Veradale, WA, a part of the city of Spokane Valley. The paved Centennial Trail passes through the city, and float trips on the Spokane River are popular in summer. (Breakfast included)

DAY EIGHT – WEDNESDAY – AUGUST 15, 2012

Today, after breakfast, we continue our westward tour past Mt. Ranier to the “Emerald City”, Seattle, Washington. The city has a beautiful location between the jagged Olympic Mountains to the west, and the volcanic peaks of the Cascade Range. Our hotel is located in the midtown area just across from the Space Needle. After check in you will have time to visit some interesting attractions close by (Breakfast included)

DAY NINE – THURSDAY – AUGUST 16, 2012

This morning you have breakfast vouchers for a great meal in the hotel. A step on guide joins us for a tour of Seattle including Chinatown, the University of Washington, several residential areas, the Pike place market, the fish ladders, and the downtown area. After lunch, on your own, we will leave the States behind and head into Canada. Please have your passports ready as we cross the border into Canada. We will spend the next three nights in the wonderful city of Vancouver, British Columbia. Our hotel is in the downtown area close to many shops, attractions, restaurants, and a large mall. (Breakfast included)

DAY TEN – FRIDAY – AUGUST 17, 2012

Get ready for another busy, exciting day. We will depart early on a local tour bus, which will take us to the ferry for our trip to Victoria, Capital of British Columbia, and the glorious Butchart Gardens. For over 100 years Butchart Gardens has been an outstanding showplace. It is built in an abandoned limestone quarry and covers 50 acres. Bring your camera for some terrific shots of the flowers. Have lunch, on own, while we are at the gardens. The coach will then take us to the downtown section of Victoria, which is most beautiful as is the waterfront and are the hotels. We will spend some time here so you can shop and sightsee. Later in the afternoon we will return by ferry to Vancouver and the coach will take us back to the hotel.

DAY ELEVEN – SATURDAY - AUGUST 18, 2012

We will tour the city of Vancouver with a guide this morning. Our tour will include Stanley Park with its outstanding Totem Poles, Queen Elizabeth Park with beautiful gardens, and the city itself. You may want to visit the downtown shops near our hotel in the afternoon. Many Chinese merchants relocated here and moved their shops to Vancouver after Hong Kong was returned to China several years ago.

DAY TWELVE – SUNDAY – AUGUST 19, 2012

The beauty of Canada will continue to reveal itself as we travel through Alberta to the beautiful city of Banff in the National Park. Lake Louise is especially beautiful. The lake is an incredibly beautiful aqua color in summer and glistening with snow and ice in winter. With snow capped mountains and Victoria glacier as backdrops it is awesome. The resort town of Banff, where we will spend two nights, is lovely with the glacial Bow River flowing through the mountain ringed

valley that is the setting for Banff. We are just a few blocks from the main shopping center. You will want to browse in the shops after we check in.

DAY THIRTEEN – MONDAY – AUGUST 20, 2012

Another exciting day is ahead of us today as we visit the Columbia Icefields and ride the giant snowmobiles to the Columbia Glacier. You will need a coat for this as it is very cold when you walk out onto the glacier. You will have time to visit the Visitor center with many displays about the history of the glacier and the icefields. We will have lunch in the cafeteria after our snowmobile tour. After enjoying the sights here, we will return to our hotel in Banff. (Breakfast and lunch included)

DAY FOURTEEN – TUESDAY – AUGUST 21, 2012

Our next two nights will be spent in Regina, capital of Saskatchewan province. This city is home to the many government buildings, parks, and the Royal Mounted Police Academy and Museum. Our hotel is on the main street close to many museums and other attractions. After check in you may want to walk around the hotel area to shop or just take in the sights. We will Be here two nights. (Breakfast included)

DAY FIFTEEN – WEDNESDAY – AUGUST 22, 2012

This morning we will leave on a guided tour of the city and outlying area. You will see the many government buildings, cathedrals and museums. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police Heritage center will be a special part of the tour. It is located at the Police Academy so you will see some of the recruits and learn about their training. Displays in the Museum include weapons, uniforms, and photographs. You will learn much about the history of this legendary police force. After the tour you will have the afternoon free to do as you choose.

DAY SIXTEEN – THURSDAY – AUGUST 23, 2012

Regretfully, today we must leave Canada behind and return to the States. We will spend the night in Fargo, North Dakota. The city was named for William George Fargo, of Wells Fargo Express Co. and is located in the fertile Red River Valley. Fargo shares close ties and the title All American City with its sister city Moorhead, MN. Other attractions here are the Fargo Air Museum, Plains Art Museum, and the Roger Maris Baseball Museum.

DAY SEVENTEEN – FRIDAY – AUGUST 24, 2012

We will have breakfast at the hotel before visiting Bonanzaville, USA. in West Fargo. This is a reconstructed historic village representing the bonanza farm era. Among the 42 buildings on the grounds are log cabins, a schoolhouse, a farm mansion, a church and a depot. Also included is a vintage automobile, tractor, and airplane museum for your enjoyment. A tram will take you through some of the sights. We will then travel on to the Minneapolis-St. Paul area of Minnesota. Probably the most visited attraction here now is the Mall of the Americas, the largest one in our country. A shuttle will take you to the mall from the hotel, just four blocks away, so you may want to catch some of it after we check in and go back for more the next day after our tour.

DAY EIGHTEEN – SATURDAY – AUGUST 25, 2012

After breakfast at the hotel a step on guide will join us for a morning tour of these twin cities. St. Paul, the capital, has some beautiful churches, parks, and high rise buildings. Minneapolis has

many art museums, shops, restaurants and Malls. There are over 1000 sparkling lakes in the metropolitan area alone, giving it the name "Land of Lakes". In the afternoon you will want to see that 4.2 million square feet area mall with its 520 shops, restaurants, and entertainment. Just board the shuttle from the hotel. (Breakfast included)

DAY NINETEEN – SUNDAY – AUGUST 26, 2012

Our travels will take us through the corn belt of our country to Bloomington, Illinois. This city was named in 1822 for its profusion of flowers. It has the only street in the union with a university at each end: Illinois State University and Illinois Wesleyan University. (Breakfast and Dinner included)

DAY TWENTY – MONDAY – AUGUST 27, 2010

Corbin, KY, is our final night of the tour. This town was made famous by Col. Harlan Sanders of Kentucky Fried Chicken fame. He started his first restaurant here and perfected his recipe for pressure frying chicken with his famous herbs and spices (Breakfast and dinner included)

DAY TWENTY ONE – TUESDAY – AUGUST 28, 2012

Our great Pacific Northwest tour ends today. We know you will have enjoyed all of the wonderful things we have seen and experienced. We will return to Charleston around 5:00 P.M. filled with unforgettable memories. (Breakfast included)
