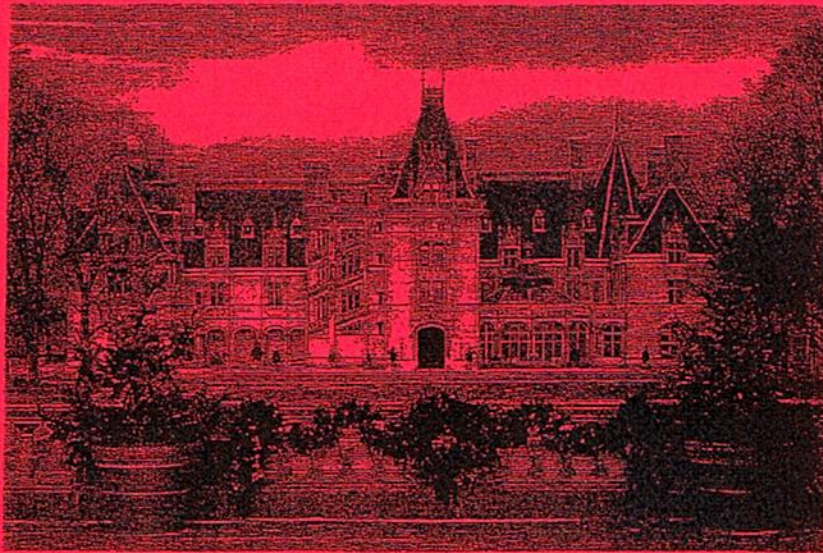


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Christmas at Biltmore *December 27 – 28, 2010* *Monday - Tuesday*
