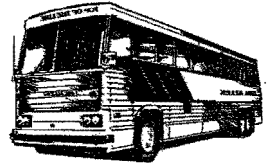
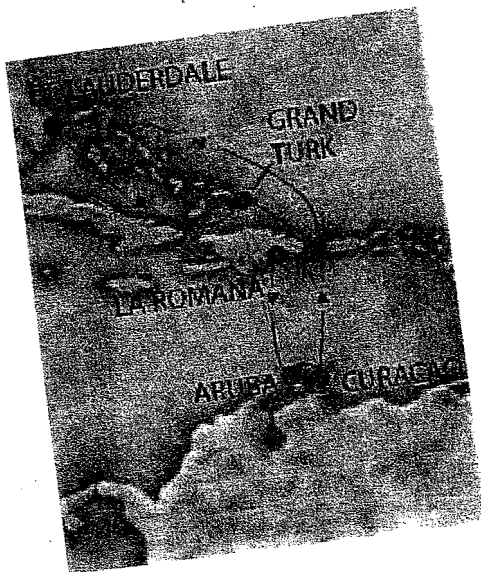
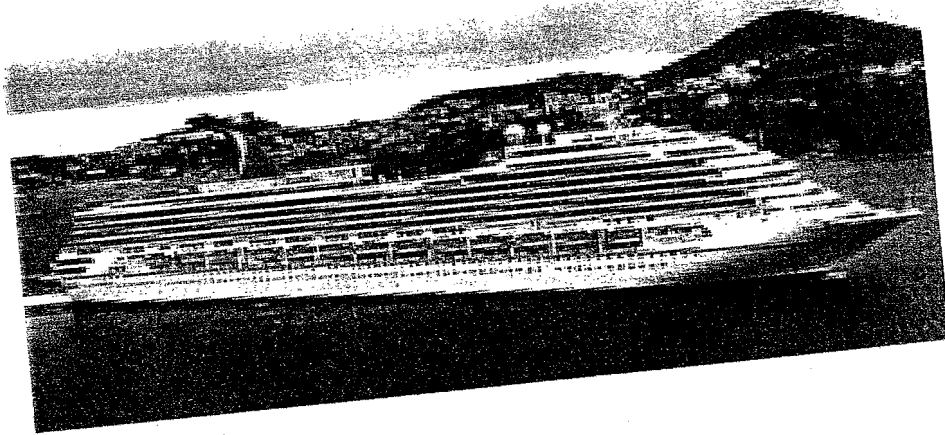

**DAY ONE – FRIDAY – JANUARY 11, 2013**

We will leave Charleston at 8:00 AM this morning for the first day of our wonderful Caribbean Cruise. Today we make our way to Titusville, Florida where we will spend the night. Our “Welcome” dinner tonight will be at the famous “Dixie Crossroads”. (DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

**DAY TWO – SATURDAY – JANUARY 12, 2013**

This morning, after a continental breakfast at the hotel, we leave for Ft. Lauderdale and the “Fun Ship” Carnival Freedom. We should arrive in plenty of time for you to have lunch on the ship and get settled before we sail this evening. The Carnival Freedom combines the amenities and excitement cruisers have come to expect. This ship offers every conceivable venue for your dining and entertainment pleasure including Carnival’s Seaside Theatre, a 12 X 22-foot outdoor screen for sports, movies and more, plus 4 pools, 6 hot tubs, a 13,300 square foot spa, self-service laundromats, jogging track, fitness center, library, 22 lounges, casino, plus more. You will have time to explore before dinner this evening. (CB BREAKFAST AND ONBOARD MEALS AND SNACKS)

**DAY THREE – SUNDAY – JANUARY 13, 2013**

Today will be spent at sea. Take time to familiarize yourself with all the ship has to offer. Relax and start on that tan! (ONBOARD SNACKS AND MEALS INCLUDED TODAY)

**DAY FOUR – MONDAY – JANUARY 14, 2013**

We arrive at our first port-of-call at 7:00 AM this morning. Today we visit Grand Turk, Turks & Caicos Islands. Grand Turks is the largest of the Turks Islands, which are named after an indigenous cactus that actually looks like it’s wearing a fez (the Turkish tassel hat). You won’t find many fezzes on the island, as there simply aren’t that many heads there to wear them! With a population of less than 4,000, what you will find is plenty of room to relax – or swim, dive, fish, and just the weather for doing it; the average temperature ranges from 80 – 90 degrees Fahrenheit, and a typical year in Grand Turk sees a full 350 days of sunshine. Check out Cockburn Town, featuring a wonderful selection of historical buildings and an unforgettable rustic charm. You’ll also find many Colonial-style buildings and ruins, along with The Turks and Caicos National Museum. Be sure to be back on the ship on time as we set sail at 2:00 PM. (MOST ONBOARD MEALS AND SNACKS TODAY)

**DAY FIVE – TUESDAY – JANUARY 15, 2013**

Today we arrive in La Romana, Dominican Republic located at the southeastern tip of the Dominican Republic. La Romana is a city built by the sugar mills before it began to blossom into a resort area. About one mile from the famous Casa de Campo Resort, this small city has some of the finest golf courses found in the Caribbean and white sand beaches are also one of the

city's main attractions. At upscale Casa del Rio, overlooking the Chavon River, you can watch artisans at work at nearby Altos de Chavon cultural village. Return to the ship in time for our 5:00 PM sailing today. (MOST ONBOARD MEALS AND SNACKS INCLUDED TODAY)

### **DAY SIX – WEDNESDAY – JANUARY 16, 2013**

This afternoon we find ourselves in – Curacao. The “C” of the tiny trio of ‘ABC Islands’ – Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao. Our ship docks at 2:00 PM. Curacao is a beautiful, secluded landmass located in the southwestern Caribbean, just off the coast of Venezuela. The island is home to about 138,000 people, who represent more than 50 nationalities and can be heard speaking Dutch, Spanish, and English...not to mention the colorful local Creole, Papiamentu. A vibrant and rich culture rooted in history and hospitality, Curacao has been home to many painters and artists of all types. The already-inviting island also features an unsurprisingly warm and sunny climate year-round. The simplicity of this colorful island makes it one of the most delightful ports of the Caribbean. City and island tours are available, highlighting the island's liqueur distillery. If exploring on your own be sure to check out the Queen Emma Floating Bridge and visit the floating market where brightly painted schooners are laden with exotic fruits and vegetables. The island's crystalline waters are also home to the Caribbean's largest protected underwater park. The view of the city from the other side of the bridge will remind you of “Rainbow Row” in Charleston and in the evening the colorful houses are outlined in lights. You will have ample time to explore this beautiful city, as we do not sail until 11:00 PM this evening. (MOST ONBOARD MEALS AND SNACKS ARE INCLUDED TODAY)

### **DAY SEVEN – THURSDAY – JANUARY 17, 2013**

This morning at 8:00 AM we dock in Aruba. This peaceful piece of paradise offers warm sun tempered by gentle trade winds, all wrapped up in a tiny package in the southern Caribbean. Try vibrant outdoor markets, magnificent beaches and lush gardens. Walk along quaint streets lined with Dutch colonial buildings typifying the island's earliest beginnings, snorkel in the most breathtaking coral area in the Caribbean, or discover the natural wonders of Aruba by visiting the Butterfly Farm or the Ayo Rock Formations. Be sure to return to the ship in time for our 4:00 PM sailing. (MOST ONBOARD MEALS AND SNACKS INCLUDED TODAY)

### **DAY EIGHT – FRIDAY – JANUARY 18, 2013**

Today will be spent at sea. Relax and catch up on your rest after all the exciting port of calls that we have visited. (MOST ONBOARD SNACKS AND MEALS TODAY)

### **DAY NINE – SATURDAY – JANUARY 19, 2013**

Today is another day spent at sea. Read, relax and enjoy all of the amenities the ship has to offer. You may also want to get an early start on repacking!! (MOST ONBOARD SNACKS AND MEALS TODAY)

### **DAY TEN – SUNDAY – JANUARY 20, 2013**

Sadly our wonderful cruise must come to an end. We arrive back in Port Everglades this morning. We will be on the road to Charleston as soon as we are able to get off the ship and loaded on the bus. There will be rest stops and meals stops en route to Charleston as needed. We should arrive back

home around 11:00 PM. (ONBOARD BREAKFAST INCLUDED PRIOR TO DISEMBARKATION)

**If you cancel on or before October 26, 2012 - full refund of monies paid**

**After this date the following CANCELLATION GUIDELINES will apply:**

**10/27/12 – 11/28/12 - \$300.00 per person penalty plus any agency commissions, insurance premiums and any monies paid out and not refunded to Top of the Line Tours.**

**11/29/12 – 12/14/12 – 50% penalty plus any agency commissions, insurance premiums and any monies paid out and not refunded to Top of the Line Tours**

**12/15/12 – 12/29/12 – 75% penalty plus any agency commissions, insurance premiums and any monies paid out and not refunded to Top of the Line Tours.**

**On or after 12/30/12 – 100% penalty.**

**You must file an insurance claim to receive a refund of any monies not refunded to you less the cost of the insurance premiums.**

**In the event of cancellation by Top of the Line Tours, all monies paid will be refunded in full.**
