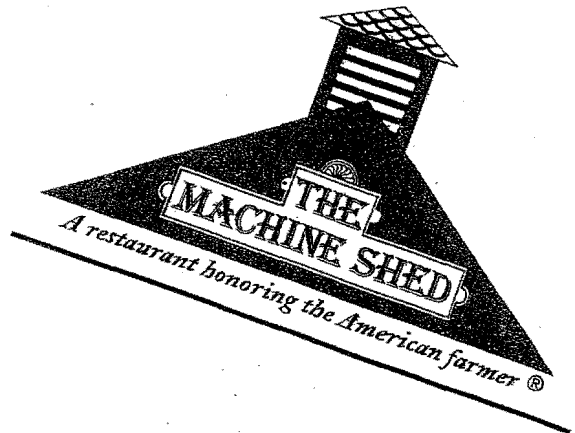
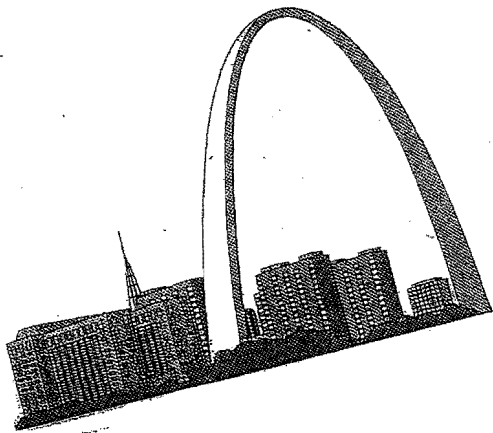
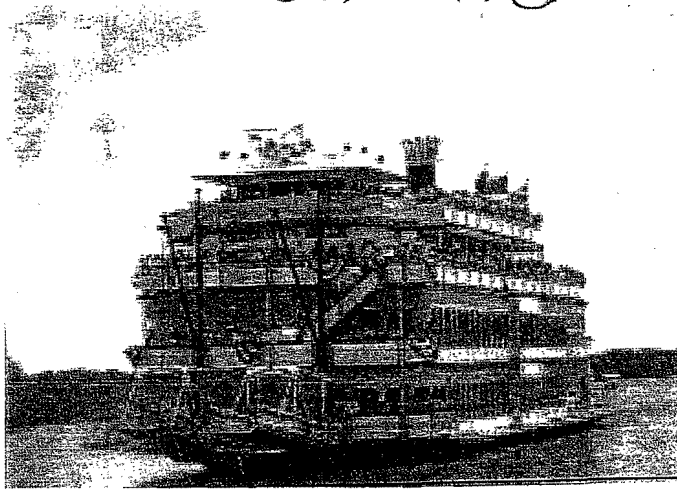

DAY ONE – SATURDAY – JULY 7, 2012

We depart Ashley Landing Mall at 5:45 AM this morning to begin our Riverboat Romance Journey. We will have a pick-up in Summerville at 6:00 AM. There will be rest stops and lunch, on own, enroute. Our first night stay will be in Clarksville, IN. Clarksville was established in 1783 on land granted to Col. George Rogers Clark and his men, who defended the territory from British assaults. In 1803 Clark's brother William met up with Corps of Discovery co-commander Meriweather Lewis in Clarksville to make final preparations for the historic expedition to the Pacific Ocean. After checking in, we will enjoy dinner on TOTL at the hotel. (DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY TWO – SUNDAY – JULY 8, 2012

We will start the day with a hot breakfast (ON TOTL) before checking out and departing for Moline, IL. There will be rest stops and lunch, on own, enroute. After checking into our hotel, Stoney Creek Inn, you will have time to freshen up and relax before dinner, on own. You might want to stretch your legs, as there are different restaurants in walking distance of the hotel. (BREAKFAST INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY THREE – MONDAY – JULY 9, 2012

After a full hot breakfast (ON TOTL), we will depart for the John Deere Harvester Works. While you ride comfortably on a tour cart, you'll get up close to combine production lines, and enjoy the exhibits. This tour shows you one of the largest production facilities in North America. From there we will go to the John Deere Pavilion. The pavilion is a unique, hands-on look at the past, present, and future of agribusiness and houses the world's largest agricultural exhibit. Adjacent to the John Deere Pavilion, the John Deere Store is a one-of-a-kind specialty retail shop with a variety of unique John Deere merchandise. Walk around the pavilion, have lunch, on own. Next on the agenda is a visit to the Deere-Wilman House and the Butterworth Center. These two majestic mansions were built in the late 1800s by Charles Deere, son of John Deere. Both offer outstanding gardens open for viewing any time during daylight hours. In the Butterworth Center, William and Katherine Butterworth purchased the prize Venetian 50-foot canvas ceiling painting. The art was never signed. For 90 years it was believed to depict the Dandolo family, but recent discoveries have revealed the Valerian brothers completed the ceiling painting in the 1720s or 1730s. Only a handful of their paintings remain. We will return to our hotel to relax and freshen up before dinner (ON TOTL) at the Iowa Machine Shed Restaurant, a tribute to the American farmer, where you will feast on a traditional, home style, made from scratch cooking. (BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY FOUR – TUESDAY – JULY 10, 2012

This morning we board the luxurious Celebration Belle Riverboat for 100-mile cruise up the Mississippi River. The day on this three-deck stern-wheeler is filled with activities and entertainment. Visit the gift shop, watch the river traffic from the open top deck, and even look into the pilothouse. We pass towering palisades, river towns and go through three huge locks. The onboard chef creates three fresh meals plus mid-afternoon snacks. The cruise ends at Dubuque, IA where our lodging for the night is located. The rest of the evening you are free. (BREAKFAST BUFFET, LUNCH BUFFET, MID-AFTERNOON SNACK, AND DINNER BUFFET INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY FIVE – WEDNESDAY – JULY 11, 2012

After a full hot breakfast (ON TOTL), we will check out and depart for Coralville, IA. Lunch, on own. A step-on guide will join us for a tour of the Amana Colonies and show us the sights in the area and tell us about its history. The Amana Colonies is one of the most unique and picturesque communities in the nation. Settled in the 1850's along the Iowa River by members of a religious sect from Germany, the Amana Colonies are seven closely united villages. The people lived here under a strict communal system

and have been organized as a joint stock corporation since 1932. From a workshop where beverages coolers were made, Amana Refrigeration, Inc., has grown into a manufacturer and international marketer of kitchen appliances. After our tour we will enjoy a delicious dinner, included, prior to returning to our hotel. (CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY SIX – THURSDAY – JULY 12, 2012

We will start the day with a hot continental breakfast, before we check out and depart for St. Louis, MO. Rest stops and lunch, on own, enroute. Upon checking into our hotel, you are free. Dinner on own. There are a good many things to see and do around our hotel located in downtown St. Louis. Five blocks away there is a very large, new casino. (BREAKFAST INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY SEVEN – FRIDAY – JULY 13, 2012

After a full hot breakfast, we will check out and depart for Grand Rivers, KY. Rest stops and lunch, on own, enroute. Grand Rivers is located “in- the-land-between-the-lakes, area of KY. You will have time to freshen up and relax after check into our hotel for tonight before departing for dinner at Pattis’ 1880s Settlement. After dinner we have seats at the Badgett Theater for “ The Fabulous 50’s Show.” Do you remember when? Take a stroll through the decade that brought us Doo-Wop, Elvis, Car Hops and the Twist. (BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY EIGHT – SATURDAY – JULY 14, 2012

Start the day with a continental breakfast, we will then check out and depart for Chattanooga, TN. Rest stops and lunch, on own, enroute. After checking into Chattanooga’s famous hotel, the Holiday Inn Choo Choo, you will have time to freshen up and visit the Model Railroad Museum. We have a real treat tonight. We will board the Southern Belle and cruise down the scenic Tennessee River as you dine on slow cooked prime rib and Creole shrimp buffet. There will be live entertainment for a toe tapping good time. (BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY NINE – SUNDAY – JULY 15, 2012

After breakfast (ON TOTL), we will check out and depart for home, with a stop for lunch at the Blue Willow Inn in Social, GA. Don’t forget to try their famous green fried tomatoes! Regretfully we will depart with fond memories. We should arrive in Charleston around 5:30 PM. (BREAKFAST AND LUNCH INCLUDED TODAY)
