There is no place on earth like the barrier islands that make up the outer banks of North Carolina. These are the islands of the infamous pirate, Blackbeard, who left legends of buried treasures, an English colony that left one of the biggest mysteries in American history and of Wilbur and Orville Wright who left us soaring. These are the islands of wild ponies and wild winds on the seas. These are places of famous lighthouses, towering sand dunes and places that you can only reach by ferry. Join us for five days on these barrier islands where there is no barriers to a trip packed with adventure, outdoor dramas, ferries, museums, parks, shops and much more.

DAY ONE – TUESDAY – JULY 6, 2010

We leave Ashley Landing Mall this morning at 6:00 AM and will make a pickup in Summerville, to begin our trip to Kill Devil Hills, NC, near Nags Head. We will have rest stops and lunch, on own, enroute. Upon arrival we will check into our hotel for a two-night stay – so you can unpack and settle in. Dinner this evening will be at Peppercorns at the hotel. Our hotel is located on the beach and the view is spectacular. You will have the evening free to relax and enjoy yourself. (DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY TWO – WEDNESDAY – JULY 7, 2010

After breakfast this morning, on TOL, we will depart for a day of sightseeing. Our first stop will be Roanoke Island where we will tour Fort Raleigh, site of the first English settlement. We will have time to tour the re-created, 16th-century Elizabethan Gardens, which has antique statuary, period furniture, rose and herb beds, and indigenous shrubs, trees, and flowers. We will travel the causeway to Manteo and visit a 22-room Christmas shop. Lunch, will be on your on own today. After lunch we will visit Jockey's Ridge State Park-the world's largest sand dune and The Wright Memorial Shaft, which was dedicated to Orville and Wilbur Wright in November of 1932. Dinner, on own, will be at Peppercorns at the hotel. This evening we have a treat for you. We will depart the hotel and go to Manteo to attend the performance of "The Lost Colony." This symphonic outdoor drama retells the story of the 1585 settlement on Roanoke Island. We will be very late getting back to our hotel. (BREAKFAST INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY THREE – THURSDAY – JULY 8, 2010

This morning after a full breakfast, on TOL, we will check out of our hotel, and travel to the Hatteras-Ocracoke Ferry and take the ferry to Ocracoke Island. Ocracoke Island is a charming fishing village adjacent to Cape Hatteras National Seashore on the Outer Banks. Ocracoke also is known to have been a hangout of Edward Teach, alias Blackbeard; the notorious pirate and his crew were killed at Teach's Hole in 1718. Legend holds that Blackbeard still wanders the area in search of his severed head. Lunch will be on your own on Ocracoke Island. Then we will embark on another ferry ride to Cedar Island, and journey to Morehead City, NC. After checking into our hotel, we will have time to freshen up before departing for dinner, on TOL. After our delicious meal, we will depart for the Crystal Coast Jamboree. Two hours of high-energy entertainment that blends Country Music with Sock Hop Oldies, Gospel, Comedy and a Patriotic Finale to end our evening. (BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY FOUR – FRIDAY – JULY 9, 2010

We will have breakfast, on TOL, at the hotel this morning prior to check out. We will depart from our hotel and begin our journey to New Bern, NC. Swiss and German colonists settled New Bern in 1710, naming it for Bern, Switzerland. New Bern also is known as the birthplace of Pepsi-Cola, invented by Caleb Bradham in 1898. His pharmacy at the corner of Middle and Pollock streets now is a soda fountain and store dedicated to soft drink memorabilia. As New

Bern celebrates its 300 years of rich heritage in 2010, there will be plenty to see. First stop is the Tryon Palace. The Tryon Palace was known in colonial time as one of the most beautiful public buildings in America. The elegant Georgian-style mansion served as both home of Royal Governor William Tryon and the capitol of the Colony of North Carolina. After the Revolutionary War, Tryon Palace became the capitol of the independent state of North Carolina. Restored to its 18th century glory, Tryon Palace is furnished with an outstanding collection of antiques and art. The grounds are devoted to extensive gardens ranging from English formal gardens to a kitchen garden to wilderness garden areas. The complex includes three contrasting homes of exceptional beauty: Robert Hay House (c.1805), the John Wright Stanly House (c.1783), and the Dixon House (c.1830). We will experience the charm of historic Downtown New Bern in a 90-minute trolley tour that includes a visit to the New Bern Academy Museum. After our tour, you will have some free time for lunch on own, before we depart for Wilmington, NC. Upon arrival we will check into our hotel and freshen up before we depart for our dinner cruise aboard the Henrietta III. We will enjoy our evening dinner while cruising the Cape Fear River. (BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY FIVE – SATURDAY – JULY 10, 2010

After a deluxe continental breakfast, we will check out of the hotel and depart for our Wilmington Trolley tour. The trolley passes by many of Wilmington's historic homes, attractions and other points of interest. Every blade of grass on the town's Civil War battlefields and every grain of sand on its 31 miles of beach perpetuate Wilmington's maritime legacy. Anchored between the Cape Fear River and the Atlantic Ocean, Wilmington was the scene of the Stamp Act resistance in 1765 and is North Carolina's principal deepwater port. We will then head for home with rest stop and lunch, on own. We should arrive home around 5:30 PM. (CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST INCLUDED TODAY)
