DAY ONE –SUNDAY – MARCH 21, 2010

We leave Ashley Landing at 7:30 AM for Jekyll Island on the Georgia coast. It is one of the "Golden Isles", as named by Spain, who claimed it in the 16th century. We will have a rest stop enroute. Just before arriving at Jekyll Island, we will stop for lunch, on our own. Once we arrive on the Island, we do a tour of Jekyll's historic district. We board a tram at the visitor's center with our guide. On our tour you will see how the "rich and famous" vacationed a century ago. In 1886 prominent East Coast millionaires Frank Henry Goodyear, Edwin and George Gould, J.P. Morgan, Joseph Pulitzer and William Rockefeller bought Jekyll Island for \$125,000. Naming themselves "The Jekyll Island Club", they built a large clubhouse and elaborate "cottages" for use as a hunting preserve and family getaway. All the social life here revolved around the Jekyll Clubhouse. By the early 20th century, Jekyll Island Club members were said to represent one-sixth of the world's wealth, and their era was called "The Gilded Age". Included in the tour will be the duBignon Cottage, "Indian Mound" which belonged to William Rockefeller and the Faith Chapel with its magnificent stained glass windows. After checking into our hotel, which is on the beach, you will be able to rest and relax until it is time to depart for dinner at Blackbeard's Restaurant, a popular beachfront restaurant that specializes in fresh Low Country seafood dishes. After dinner we will return to our hotel and you will have the rest of the evening free. You may want to take a leisurely stroll along the beach, or just relax by one of the two-oceanfront swimming pools. (DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY TWO – MONDAY– MARCH 22, 2010

This morning after breakfast at the hotel we depart for Historic Brunswick, Georgia where we will pick up our local guide for a tour. Brunswick was founded in 1771 on a peninsula that juts into the Brunswick River, the city was named for Braunschweig, Germany, the ancestral home of King George II. After our tour you will have some free time in Brunswick for lunch on your own. After lunch we will depart for St. Simons Island, Georgia where we will meet a local guide for a tour of St. Simons Island and Fort Frederica – Colonial America's Frontier Post. We will also visit historic Christ Church with its beautiful stained glass windows. The area around Gascoigne Bluff served as the headquarters for English ships after 1736. Land disputes between Spain and England exploded in 1742 with the Battle of Bloody Marsh. Timber cut on the island was used in the first ships of the US Navy, including the USS Constitution. The village at the island's southern tip includes an 1872 working lighthouse and coastal history museum. After our tour you will have some free time in The Village to browse and shop before departing for dinner at the Mullet Bay Restaurant, the Island's local favorite. After dinner we will return to our hotel and you will have the rest of the evening to relax. (CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY THREE – TUESDAY– MARCH 23, 2010

After a continental breakfast, we will depart for our next destination. Upon arrival in Macon, Georgia you will have some free time in Central City Park, the hub of festival activities, to browse and have lunch on your own. After lunch we will do a Cherry Blossom Trail Riding tour with a step-on guide. We will then check into our hotel for a one-night stay before we depart for dinner and a tour at the Sidney Lanier Cottage (circa 1842). We also have a character actor who portrays Sidney Lanier himself for entertainment. A wonderful poet, who actually wrote the "Marshes of Glynn" while on

Jekyll. After dinner we will do an Illumination Tour of Historic Macon to round off the evening. (CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST AND DINNER INCLUDED TODAY)

DAY FOUR –WEDNESDAY - MARCH 24, 2010

This morning, after breakfast, included, we will checkout and depart the hotel with our step-on guide for a tour of Historic Macon. Our tour also includes a stop at St. Joseph's Catholic Church, this circa 1903 church crowns downtown with 200-foot spires and stunning stained glass windows. Your tour will include entrance into the Hay House (circa 1860), and the Cannonball House (circa 1853). After the tour you will have some free time at the Mulberry Street Arts and Crafts Festival. This event has been part of Macon for over 30 years. You may want to have lunch on your own at the International Food Festival before departing for Charleston. There will be rest stops enroute. We should arrive in Charleston around 6:00 PM. (DELUXE CONTINENTAL BREAKFAST INCLUDED TODAY)
